We will use a combination of in class and pull out programs to serve our students based on need • LETRS PD for K-3 teachers to support ELs in reading instructional needs • Provide systematic, explicit and evidence based interventions for students who are not meeting state standards • Learning walks opportunities given to teachers with Title III Supervisor to observe and implement EL strategies • Administration will perform drop ins to assess how skills from monthly EL PD are being implemented and follow up as needed
